The PACS programme attaches great importance to theory. At the same time it discusses and demonstrates the practical relevance of these concepts and methods in the seminars. The courses analyse specific conflicts and cases and offer practical skills of conflict management. PACS focuses on human right issues, conflict analyses and normative issues of a global peace order. It offers students a broad education in theories and methods of Peace and Conflic Studies and enables them to develop strong analytical and practical skills.

The aim of the study programme is the interactive exchange of knowledge about theories and methods of peace and conflict studies. Students acquire skills an competences for the analysis of social and political contexts. The curriculum has two equally weighted parts. On the one hand, students deal with the causes c violent conflicts. On the other, they examine the transformation of conflicts and the stabilisation of fragile societies utilising non-violent resolution mechanisms.

The study programme not only creates new scientists. It is also prepares graduates for a future career in international institutions and non-government organizations or other administrative structures. Peace and Conflict Studies graduates typically work in one of the following fields:
