Cooperation Partners

PACS is one out of 40 German development-related postgraduate courses funded by DAAD. The AGEP -**The German Association of Postgraduate Programmes with special Relevance to Developing Countries** is an umbrella organization comprising these postgraduate study programmes oriented to developing and threshold countries as well as countries with economies in transition. The different postgraduate courses cooperate with each other, to offer students a greater amount of courses and additional qualifications and to enhance their study experience in Germany.

In an exchange of modules, PACS students can attend the seminar *Journalists as Actors in War and Armed Conflict* with Prof. Dr. Eric Chouviré at the Hochschule. In exchange, students from the Master in Journalism of the Hochschule Magdeburg-Stendal come to the OVGU to attend the lecture *Introduction to Peace and Conflict Studies* with the new PACS freshmen. The cooperation gives our PACS students an insight into the practical aspects of the relationship between media and conflict and the students of the Hochschule Magdeburg-Stendal a more theoretical insight into the causes of conflict.

We are further delighted about our cooperation with the Friedrich-Schiller-Universität Jena. Up to four students of the master program International Organisations and Crisis Management of the FSU can attend courses from PACS during the winter semester. In exchange, up to four students from our program can attend the following modules/courses from the Master's program International Organisations and Crisis Management at FSU in the summer semester:

- ▶ Summer School Crisis Management
- ▶ Practical module
- ▶ Seminar in the module Crisis Management

In an Erasmus exchange, PACS students have the possibility to study the programme *Legal, Economic and Social Studies* at the Université Savoie Mont Blanc in Chambéry/Jacob-Bellecombette directly in the Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes region in south-east France. The semester starts at the beginning of September and lasts until late December. Students are expected to spend an average of 20 hours per week in the classroom. International students on the programme will attend classes along with local students and language students. Courses are taught by lecturers and professors from the Law Faculty and the Faculty of Humanities. Tailored for international students, this programme offers a unique academic experience in the French Alps.
